- Setting clear lines of authority and responsibilities.
- Reviewing and defining powers of Town Administrator.
- Reviewing and defining powers of elected and appointed boards.
- Coordinating operations of various departments.

February 2021	Finalize Charter Based on Feedback and Present to Select Board for Inclusion on Town Warrant
March-April 2021	Continued Public Outreach
May 2021	Town Meeting Deliberation and Vote
Thereafter	Submit to State Legislature for Approval
